## Northern Arizona Church Planting Region Report & Update for Summer 2018

River Valley, Grand Canyon, Desert Pines, Four Corners and Yavapai Baptist Associations

Revival and Spiritual Awakening is coming to many of our church planting areas! Henry Blackaby believes God has answered a sixtyyear-old prayer "for a mighty outpouring of the Spirit of God and



revival on the Native American people, on their reserves, in their cities, in their families, and among their young people and children." Many Christian leaders are now seeing the beginning of this spiritual revival including a fresh church planting movement! Pictured above is a baptism service at the **Cornfields Baptist Church**, one of our newest Navajo churches under the leadership of Pastor Mark Williams. On this same day, this new church baptized an eight-year-old boy and an eighty-year-old man. Cornfields has already launched a second work in nearby **Steamboat**. We desire to see new churches planted very naturally and organically in many places reaching many kinds of people. We will continue to see a need for city and rural churches as well as new churches focused on affinities and unique cultures in Arizona including Native American churches, Set Free churches, Cowboy Churches, Apartment Churches, Prison Yard Churches, and Biker Churches to name a few. A true and biblical vision for church planting is really a vision of multiplication and a vision of "making disciples of all the nations."

Native American Church Planting Network, Navajo, Hopi, Hualapai, & Havasupai Nations

The Keams Canyon Community Church has recently voted to affiliate with Southern Baptists and the Four Corners Baptist Association. Michael Campbell will serve as the founding pastor and we are praying to God to raise up native leadership and bless this church with a powerful witness in the Keams Canyon Community and in the Hopi Nation. The Burton Baptist Church is also a partner in this work. Our new church plant in Indian Wells with Pastor Sanford Dick and wife, Sadie is now conducting Sunday services and working in partnership with the Desert Pines and Four Corners Baptist Associations, and Silver Lake Family Fellowship. Holbrook is still serving initially as a geographical "hub" for planting these Native churches and our desire is for God to bring together partners and partnerships to help shape the right strategy for these new works. God has raised up new native leadership for our new church in Coppermine and Pastor Jessie Billy is exploring and cultivating a new church plant in Twin Mesa. Mission teams from Abilene and El Paso Texas and Phoenix are bringing youth mission teams to these areas this summer. Through the leadership of Happy Valley Baptist Church, we are making continued visits in the Supai Village, building relationships, and hopefully a foundation for a new church plant. Steven and Keely Sage are continuing to lead the work in Peach Springs with four Celebrate Recovery groups meeting weekly and exploring new opportunities in Supai. OneChurch of Conway Arkansas has just completed a great summer project working directly with the Hualapai Tribe and our new church plant in Peach Springs. Calvary Baptist Lake Havasu City continues to use some awesome teams for Family Fun Days in Peach Springs and First Southern Kingman is our sponsor for our Celebrate Recovery ministry and the host for the Arkansas missions team. Future possible church plant locations include Pinion, Page, Narrow Canyon, Bitter Springs, and Black Mesa Areas.

#### Prescott, Arizona

The Yavapai Baptist Association, along with First Southern Prescott Valley and First Southern Chino Valley, have recently launched two restarts. Cordes Lake, Generations Church under the leadership of Pastor Jamie Long is experiencing new life and growth and seeing new opportunities to minister to you. Plans for a new church plant in Paulden are underway and we are praying for the right church planter to lead this work. Dewey Fellowship is continuing to reach out to new families in the Prescott Valley area, conducting Vacation Bible School and searching for land.

#### **Kingman and Bullhead City Areas**

Three new portable baptistries have been ordered for our Yard Churches at Arizona State Prison. Each of these yard churches are now averaging around 200 men in attendance in Sunday morning worship. Many are awaiting baptism! New Church Planter Leadership/Ministry classes are being conducted on the Cerbat units with 25 men in each class. The **Desert Shores Church** is working on a fresh and new strategy for our Apartment Church which will include extended ministry and outreach in **Laughlin and Sunridge** apartment community. New Set Free Churches are projected for the **Kingman and Bullhead City** areas.

## Flagstaff Arizona and Northern Arizona University

Our newest church plant in the Flagstaff Area is **Elevation Church**, Pastor Kevin Dunlap and wife Codi. Their desire is to work in partnership with the **Grand Canyon Baptist Association**, **Arizona Southern Baptist Convention**, **and North American Mission Board** in planting a new church with a strong, small group-discipleship model focusing on young families in the older, downtown area of **Flagstaff**. Through the ministry of **Christian Challenge** we are continuing to pray for God to raise up a second Collegiate-Focused church close to NAU. **All Nations Church**, Pastor Sung Cha and wife Esther are continuing to focus on reaching Asian scholars and students from Northern Arizona University. This new church also conducts several projects on the Navajo Reservation.

## Aletheia Church, Sedona Arizona

Aletheia Church continues making a powerful and positive impact in the Sedona community, building relationships and networks through community service events, providing strong biblical teaching and discipleship, caring for the needs of hurting people, and making inroads into the new age culture. A special thanks to **Crestview Baptist Church** for graciously sharing their beautiful facilities with this new church. Churches in Arizona, including **Fort Mojave**, and churches as far away as **South Carolina** have partnered with this work. They have just completed some great sports camps in the **Sedona** community.

### Set Free Desert Network—Kearny, Arizona—Needles and Desert Center, California

We are continuing to see God open doors for a new network of Set Free churches beginning in the **Yucaipa California** Area and expanding through **Desert Center and Needles California**. New Set Free Churches are being projected for **Blythe California** and the **Buckeye West Valley area of Phoenix**. Needles is continuing to have many baptisms in the beautiful Colorado River. Both **Needles and Desert Center** have multiplied with additional **Biker Tabernacle** church plants and all of our Set Free churches in this network relate closely and partnership together in many outreach projects. Extended ministry is now being conducted in **Blythe, California** and a new Set Free church plant projected there. Our newest plants include a Set Free Church in the Kearny community. We are praying for God to raise up the right leadership and team to launch this new church.

#### **Greater Show Low Area**

All praise to God for the continued growth and ministry of the **Silver Lake Family Fellowship**. This new church has started a new weekly Celebrate Recovery Ministry and has ordained some of their first deacons and are developing new leadership. Adjacent land has been secured for future growth and they are now a new partner with the **Indian Wells** church plant. A special thanks to the **Desert Pines Baptist Association** and **Linden Hills Family Fellowship** for their vision of planting more churches in the Show Low area. **The WHY Church** is now launching and conducting bible study ministries in cluster areas under the leadership of Pastor Byron Brown. New locations for church plants are being explored in the **Park Valley, Bison Ranch, and Taylor Areas**.
